COMPOSITION BRIEF

- Choose category A) Music composed for use in a Shakespeare Play
 - Music inspired by a Shakespeare Play
- Piece to be composed for 1 or more musicians/singers
- To be played on one or more different instruments and/or voices
- To be of no more than three minutes duration

B)

- Reflect on which play it is for and write in 250 words, with accurate spelling
- ~ why you consider your composition is appropriate for the play
- ~ why you chose your particular style
- \sim the development process behind the composition
- Submit as a recording on a CD and in hard copy format (DO NOT send it by email)
- Entrants must be a Friend of SGCNZ either through their school or individually.

- All finalists may attend SGCNZ's National University of Otago Sheilah Winn Shakespeare Festival at Queen's Birthday weekend in Wellington, including attending the workshops on Sunday 4 June 2017 free-of-charge.
- The Supreme Winner and other placings will be announced at the Award Ceremony in the evening of Sunday 4 June at the Opera House at 7.00pm. The Winners' compositions will be played at that time.
- The Supreme Winner is awarded a position as Student Composer at SGCNZ's National Shakespeare Schools Production from 1-9 October 2017 in Wellington, and to be considered for selection as a member of SGCNZ YSC 2018 representing NZ in the UK at the Globe and Stratford Upon Avon. (Standard fees for both these events will apply).
 Please note that only one person (if Supreme Winner is a group) can attend NSSP.
