

SGCNZ TEACHERS GO GLOBAL 2026

Shakespeare Globe Centre New Zealand's Teachers Go Global (SGCNZ TGG) 2026 is in place! Do apply to join it!!

We have had to make preliminary flight bookings already and must have a minimum of 12 participants. See Criteria below.

Attached please find an application form due at the latest by 10 November 2025. These will be assessed as they are received, so it is a matter of 'first in, first served'.

Once your application is accepted, it represents a firm commitment. Note that the Registration Fee of \$300 is payable to SGCNZ, and Deposit of \$750 to our Travel Agent, Kerry Maher, both of which are non-refundable.

Benefits of the Course

Of the 61 Alumni of the 5 SGCNZ TGG courses to date, many cite involvement in it has resulted in greater acknowledgement in their own schools or groups, successful applications for new positions in schools, successes in SGCNZ's Regional and National Festivals, having students chosen to go to SGCNZ National Shakespeare Schools Production (SGCNZ NSSP) and SGCNZ Young Shakespeare Company (SGCNZ YSC).

The skills learnt do not just apply to Shakespeare - they are completely transferable into all teaching curricula, situations and for any ages. Most of all, the course provides professional and personal development, and general capability building.

A very draft Schedule is attached. The draft Budgets for both the course at the Globe and for staying on with the SGCNZ YSC to travel to Stratford Upon Avon for more Shakespeare experiences, are attached. An additional amount of \$900 (approx) is recommended for lunches, theatre tickets over and above than those listed as included in the Budget, socialising, personal necessities... We supply you with an Oyster Card, pre-loaded with £30 for local UK travel.

Criteria and how to apply Rationale & Outline

This two-week course at Shakespeare's Globe, London (inclusive of travel time) from Friday 3 -17July (school holidays) - or till 22 July, if taking up the optional trip to Stratford Upon Avon at the end. The course is designed as a professional development opportunity for teachers from throughout New Zealand of students from Years 1 – 13, especially, but not solely Drama or English. Tertiary Tutors, Home School Educators, Community Drama Tutors and private sector Speech and Drama Teachers may also apply.

The course will run in parallel with, though be largely independent of, SGCNZ's Young Shakespeare Company 2026 study and performance trip. This intensive course will conclude with a *Midnight Matinee* to an invited public showcase performance of scenes on the Globe stage on 16 July, including a short one by the Teachers. (This is late at night as the performers are not Actors' Equity registered and are therefore unable to present a publicly ticketed performance.)

Stratford Upon Avon Extension Friday afternoon 17 July-Monday 20 July
En route to Heathrow Walking Tour of Oxford & short stop in Windsor

Departure from Heathrow Friday 17 July (if doing only Globe Course) Arrival back in NZ Monday 20 July



Or

Departure from Heathrow Monday evening 20 July (if going on to Stratford Upon Avon) Arrive in Auckland Wednesday morning 22 July

Anyone wishing to go to the UK earlier or stay on later can do so but alterations to booking dates must be done through Kerry Maher in order to retain our cheaper air fares. Once secured, \$500 (approx) additional fee is charged by the airline for changes in travel dates. Only one change may be made under the group (cheaper price) booking Kerry has secured. If you want to make any more than that, you become responsible for all your own bookings – which mean that it could present difficulties in arriving on time.

Attending the whole course is compulsory and, as previous participants who stayed privately discovered, needs to be live-in at LSE Bankside House with all. This is essential for discussions required by Tutors and the Director outside session times, line-learning, developing a sense of çompany', not wasting valuable time and money travelling locally each day...

The Full Trip Fee is an estimate dependent on fare and accommodation increases and exchange rate - obviously extremely volatile at present... Arrangements for delayed 'drip feed' payments may be negotiated with Dawn Sanders and Kerry Maher

Withdrawal could affect the whole programme, as the minimum number of 11 teachers must be maintained. In the very unlikely chance of you having to withdraw, a refund of the amounts not marked 'non-refundable' will be made, **less** actual monies Kerry Maher has had to expend, which are non-refundable to him, paid already – ie airfares and other UK travel, accommodation...

All funding must be obtained by the selected Teachers. A letter of reference is given to successful applicants stating they are representing New Zealand, as well as their school/group and SGCNZ.

SGCNZ will act as the umbrella organisation where necessary for funding eg from schools, Rotary and Lions Clubs, gaming and other trusts. A list of fundraising suggestions will follow once you have registered.

Expectations

- The group will work with Globe Education personnel and the Globe's experts on text, voice and movement, along with other high calibre Globe practitioners over the course
- A full commitment must be made to the course
- The teacher needs to have a desire to share knowledge gained through the course
- Agreement must be made to have your students participate in SGCNZ VUW Regional Shakespeare Festivals and/or Essay, Costume, Music Composition, Static Image, Poster, DVD Design Competitions; or if a teacher of primary age students, in SGCNZ's Primarily Playing with Shakespeare—if not already doing so
- It must be clearly understood from the outset that selection does not carry any funding with it except that SGCNZ takes a minimal fee for actual printing, phone and stationery costs I raise funding to cover SGCNZ's organisational time
- Applications must be made exclusively through Shakespeare Globe Centre New Zealand
- All successful applicants need to be (or become) financial individual members of SGCNZ (deducted from Registration Fee). It does have benefits at the Globe with 10% discounts in the Globe food outlets and shop physical and on-line

Outcomes

The anticipated outcomes are that you will have:

- acquired myriad transferable skills
- observed and acquired a wide range of pedagogical skills and methodology
- gained first-hand experience of Globe Education practices and their application
- gained detailed practical and theoretical insights into Shakespeare's stage craft and Elizabethan Theatre as revealed by the architecture of the 'Wooden O'
- explored performance practices in relation to Shakespeare and how expand on them
- learnt from hearing and engaging in the thought-provoking sessions on gender, race, culture, environmental and other issues in relation to Shakespeare and beyond
- observed performances by Globe actors with direct address in shared light
- had valuable discussions with some actors as well as the high calibre Globe Practitioners (Tutors) and Director
- gained acting experience on the Globe stage



- used the Globe's resources to examine the range of practical knowledge gathered by Globe Education and other staff over the past 27 years
- contributed positively to the group dynamics
- increased your whanau and, in many cases, life-long connections

Requirements

- Payments, made on time, as per schedule (unless specially negotiated alternative timing)
- A Report (min 500 words+) from each participant will be required by 31 August 2026 it is anticipated that this will also be what is used for compliance to your sponsors/donors/other funders
- In line with its ethos of maximising the benefits of the experience, and in respect to the facilitation role played by SGCNZ, it is required that the Teachers will be involved in SGCNZ activities, as is appropriate, and be advocates and ambassadors for SGCNZ, including assisting long-term with encouraging funding of the organisation

Course Content

- The Teachers will work closely with Globe Education Department and Theatre Faculty
- The course schedule will include
 - sessions with the key Tutors of Movement, Voice and Text, Music & Wardrobe
 - tours of the Globe, the Rose & the National Theatre
 - study of Elizabethan stages
 - talks and Q&As with Globe actors and/or directors
 - rehearsals by a Globe Education Department director
 - performing a short scene on the Globe stage
 - attending performances
 - some interaction with SGCNZ Young Shakespeare Company (especially if adding on Stratford Upon Avon trip)

The Process

To apply to be a Teacher Go Global in 2026:

- Write a statement of intent of approximately 250 words explaining:
 - why you are attracted to apply for the programme
 - your anticipated outcomes from the course
 - how you will engage with SGCNZ and its activities on your return and previous interaction with SGCNZ
- Submit a brief CV, including experience in teaching Shakespeare (1 page max)
- Send a head and shoulders photo (suitable and available for reproduction up to A4 size in the media and on the web), file no larger than 1MB. If hard copy, write your name and that of the photographer on the back and permission to use it
- Include a Reference from your Principal or other appropriate person regarding your teaching skills
- Supply contact details of another character referee
